Evangelia Papoutsaki, PhD is an Associate Professor and Program Leader at the University of Central Asia; Research Fellow at Unitec Institute of Technology, New Zealand; Editor in Chief of ePress; member of the Royal Society of New Zealand; and former Research Associate at the Pacific Media Centre, AUT. She held recently an International Research Fellowship at the Center for Pacific Islands Research at Kagoshima University where she developed a islands communicative ecology mapping approach (ICE). Her professional background and academic interests are on development and communication for social change with a strong interest in island studies. She has extensive experience in the Pacific, including her previous position as Head of Communication Arts Department at DWU in Papua New Guinea and involvement in major research projects [research advisor to Komuniti Tok Piksa project that uses visual methods for community dialogue and change in the context of HIV/AIDS in PNG; Chief co-investigator in a research consortium that conducted a 14 Pacific Islands State of the Media and Communication research project]. She is at the editorial board of Island Studies Journal, SHIMA, the co-founder of the Contemporary PNG Studies Journal and former Reviews Editor of the Pacific Journalism Review.
